



Dear Friends,

Today, as I commence my tenure as the <u>President of the University of Haifa</u>, I am honored to address you—our family of supporters and partners.

It was 22 years ago that I arrived at the University of Haifa as a young historian. I began my journey in the Department of Land of Israel Studies and have served the University ever since in a variety of roles: Department Chair, Head of the School of History, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities, and most recently, Rector. Between 2009 and 2011 I took a sabbatical at NYU, Columbia, and Rutgers. After returning to Israel, I established the Ruderman Program for American Jewish Studies. The University of Haifa is my second home, and often, my first.

We are a University that embraces the remarkable resources that surround us – the Mountains, the City, and the Sea. These are our natural laboratories, and this is what sets us apart from other universities in Israel. I am proud to share that The University of Haifa was ranked in the top 100 universities in the world in the *Times Higher Education 2024 IMPACT Rankings*. Following our lead, the Council of Higher Education in Israel placed sustainability as a priority and allocated a great deal of competitive funds for sustainability research. The University of Haifa's sustainability vision will continue to be part of our strategic goals in the coming years.

Alongside our vision, the University faces two remarkable opportunities. The first is the integration of the School of Design into the University. The School's faculty members and students are located in the German Colony neighborhood of Haifa and they will become full members of our University community. For the first time in Israel, a School of Design will operate as an integral part of a university, thus allowing a plethora of collaborations and combinations not found elsewhere in Israel.

The second opportunity is a groundbreaking one – the establishment of the **Herta and Paul Amir School of Medicine**. On October 1st 2025, after many years of anticipation, the University of Haifa will welcome its inaugural cohort of 60 pioneering medical students. Together, we will usher in a new era of medicine in the North and across Israel.

Lastly, I have compiled a top-notch leadership team that will propel our University to new heights. My leadership team includes *Prof. Mouna Maroun*, our Rector, and *Mr. Sharon Zaid*, our Vice President and CEO. And I am truly delighted to introduce you to two additional members of our team. Please welcome *Mr. Gideon Herscher*, the University's new Vice President of Transformational Philanthropy and Global Resource Development. Gideon previously served as a senior development executive at the JDC, one of the premier Jewish philanthropic organizations in the world. We wish him great success in his new and important role.

We have recently established a Global Engagement Division, headed by **Prof. Tally Katz-Gerro.** This division's mandate is to promote international collaborations on all levels of the University: departments, faculty and students, including our University's growing international school.
